




Giving Life to the Salmon, Giving Life to the Park

The District of Squamish prides itself as the Outdoor Recreational Capital of Canada, creating a unique interface between the landscape and built environment. This project uses the design of riparian buffers as a framework for program layout, that emphasizes the importance of protecting salmon and educating the park users. 






RIPARIAN AREA ENCROACHMENT






