GENERAL SUMMARY

Under the supervision of the Electrical Supervisor, this position installs, maintains, and troubleshoots electrical, building and SCADA systems, industrial instrumentation and assists in networks, including communication equipment.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Customer Service

Main Duties and Responsibilities

- Installs, maintains, troubleshoots, tests and repairs all industrial electrical motors, pumps, fans, lighting, controls, instrumentation, analyzers, actuators, adjustable speed drives, and all other related electrical equipment used in throughout the District of Squamish's Water Distribution, Wastewater Treatment, Wastewater Collections, Drainage Pump Houses and Facilities.
- Installs and Troubleshoots SCADA Systems, RTUs, and PLCs.
- Works closely with staff and consultants to plan improvements and complete work on the District's electrical systems.
- Operates all systems and equipment in compliance with the Canadian Electrical Code, Electrical Safety Standards and all other applicable standards and operating procedures.
- Maintains inventory of parts.
- Oversees budget effectively by getting quotes, issuing Purchase Orders (PO's) and follows up on work completion.
- Works cooperatively with other departments and contractors.
- Supervises staff when required.
- Other duties as assigned.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS & ABILITIES

- Thorough knowledge of electrical and instrumentation principals.
- Thorough knowledge of the installation of electrical equipment related to pump/lift stations, diesel generators, pressure transmitters, flow meters and associated instrumentation.
- Thorough knowledge of relevant WorkSafe BC and Electrical Safety Standards regulations.
- Working knowledge of building, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation, and automation equipment and systems, including SCADA.
- Proficiency of related industry codes such as the Canadian Electrical Code and CSA Electrical Safety Z462
- Good understanding of SCADA and PLC Programming.
- Excellent computer skills including proficiency with Microsoft Office.
- Excellent electrical/instrumentation trouble-shooting skills.
- Excellent written and oral communication skills to interface with customer base.
- Good project management and organizational skills, must be able to multi-task various projects.
- Demonstrated ability to create and execute work plans.
- Ability to read and interpret blueprints, line drawings and schematics.
- Ability to work independently and with minimal supervision.
- Ability to maintain records, estimate materials required and requisition parts and materials as required.



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- Ability to work safely and in compliance with the District of Squamish Health and Safety Policy, Worksafe BC, WHIMIS and TDG policies procedures and regulations.
- Knowledge of Fire Alarm, Security, and Access Control Systems.
- Must possess the ability to work in conditions as outlined below.

WORKING CONDITIONS

- This position involves fieldwork requiring frequent walking in operational areas to identity problems or hazards.
- Employees working in the field are exposed to a variety of conditions including loud noise levels, vibrations, hot and cold temperatures, inclement weather conditions, heat and humidity.
- Ability to work in confined spaces; water, drainage and wastewater sites; climb and descend ladders and antennas at heights; operate a variety of power tools and construction equipment.
- Ability to lift, carry, push and pull materials and objects up to 50 pounds.
- Required to work periodically for emergencies, including after hours, stand-by, weekends, and holidays.
