



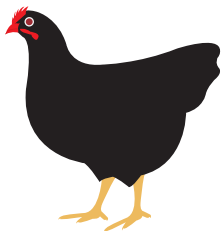
## Keeping urban hens

The District of Squamish supports local food production. Ensure you are informed about best care practices and able to commit to the demands of caring for hens long-term as well as the applicable bylaws.

Precautions must be taken to avoid attracting wildlife such as bears, coyotes, cougars and wolves. Coop areas must be enclosed by an electric fence.

All urban hens are required to be registered.

## Steps to keeping hens

### STEP 1 Review and understand the bylaws.

Before you start raising urban hens, it is important to read and understand the municipal regulations that govern the keeping of urban hens:

- Animal Control Bylaw
- Zoning Bylaw
- Wildlife Attractant Bylaw

### STEP 2 Understand the best practices are for keeping hens in an urban environment.

### STEP 3 Register your urban hens with the District of Squamish.

## Summary of Conditions

Residents on a residential lot within the District of Squamish are permitted up to a maximum of five (5) urban hens and must be a resident of the property where the urban hens are kept.

Urban hens are permitted in all zones are permitted, but land titles must be checked as there are areas within the District that have covenants on land title that specifically restrict land use and may not allow keeping of urban hens

- No roosters are permitted
- No sale of eggs or slaughter of chickens permitted
- Secure all urban hen food that is stored outdoors from vermin and wildlife
- Construct and secure coop and pen from other animals and prevent any rodent from harboring underneath or within it or within its walls.



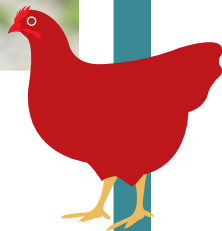
## You are Required to Register Your Hens

Failure to register your hens is a ticketable offence of \$100 under Animal Control Bylaw 2124.
