Curbside Collection: What goes where?



ORGANICS

Do not use "compostable" or "biodegradable" plastic bags.



Food Scraps

Any kind of food scraps: Fruit, seafood, meat, bones, breads, vegetables, nuts and shells, jack o'lanterns, pizza, dairy, eggs, candy, popcorn, pasta.

Wood Products

Food soiled tissues, napkins & paper towels, teabags, wooden utensils, popsicle sticks, toothpicks, coffee filters and grounds, wood shavings, sawdust, and soiled pizza boxes.



Liquids Condiments, sauces, syrups, cooking oils (no containers).

Plant Materials Small branches, plants, and grass clippings.

NOT FOR ORGANICS

- Ashes
- Invasive species
- Pet waste or litter box material
- Plastic bags (even labeled "compostable" or "biodegradable")

RECYCLING

Rinse and dry all containers. No glass or flexible plastic packaging!



Mixed Plastic Containers

Mixed plastic containers, plastic jugs and tetrapaks, ice-cream containers, plastic, and metal capped cardboard containers. FROZEN



Single Use

Single-use cups and plastic to go containers, and rinsed single-use coffee pods.



NOT FOR CURBSIDE RECYCLING

- Books (Donate)
- Clothing and fabric (Donate)
- Compostable and biodegradable plastic (Garbage)
- Glass (Drop off) Hygiene products

Paper and

Cardboard

Flattened cardboard, newspapers, flyers, magazines, catalogues, toilet and paper towel rolls, paper bags, paperbased coffee cups and lids, paper straws, envelopes (windows allowed), and wrapping paper (no glitter, shiny wrapping paper or tape allowed).

GARBAGE

When in doubt, throw it out! It is better to put things in the garbage than contaminate our local recycling efforts!

Broken Goods

Broken plastic toys without batteries, broken crockery and ceramics, broken holiday decorations, ripped ribbons, bows, and foil wrapping, torn and ripped books.





Garden Goods

Smokes Cigarettes (tobacco or cannabis), cigars, butts and ashes.



Health and Hygiene

Home healthcare waste, cleaning and sanitary wipes, diapers and sanitary products, personal hygiene products, cotton balls, swabs and pads, blister packaging, gloves and masks.
